Neighborhood Business District Support Program Budget

As discussed at the January 18 meeting, the City has reduced 2010 funding for this program to \$2,000 from \$7,000 previously. Tom Croft, NBD Program Manager will propose a budget for approval at the March 15 General Meeting including \$1,600 for beautification projects, \$300 for Holiday on the Hill, and \$100 for CNBDU dues. All residents of East Price Hill are eligible to vote, not only EPHIA members. Director John Lauck will be taking over as NBD Program Manager.

Keep America Beautiful's **Great American Cleanup (GAC)**, the nation's largest community improvement program, takes place annually from March 1 through May 31, involving an estimated 2.8 million volunteers and attendees. The hardworking volunteers donated more than 8 million hours in 2009 to clean, beautify and improve more than 17,000 communities during more than 30,000 events in all 50 states and beyond. Activities included beautifying parks and recreation areas, cleaning seashores and waterways, handling recycling collections, picking up litter, planting trees and flowers, and conducting educational programs and litter-free events.

Because of the hard work by EPHIA volunteers at last year's cleanup, EPHIA was honored with a 1st place award by Keep Cincinnati Beautiful. Last year was the second year the association has been honored with a 1st place award..

The **Ohio Department of Transportation** and **Keep Cincinnati Beautiful** have promised to clean up our city's **ten dirtiest entry and exit ramps**, but we need your help!

For years, volunteers with **Keep Cincinnati Beautiful** and the **Ohio Department of Transportation** have been working to keep litter off of our Ohio State roadways.
